Meeting at Airedale CDC, Tuesday 11th June, 8pm – The Anat Baniel Method

The speaker this month is Bill Windle who will talk about The Anat Baniel Method (ABM) Help for Children with Special Needs: ABM is a non-medical breakthrough approach that focuses on the child's brain and its remarkable abilities to change and learn. Bill will look at Autism Spectrum Disorders, ADHD, Cerebral Palsy and Undiagnosed Development Issues. The evening will consist of a brief talk, a short, gentle ABM movement lesson, Q&As and maybe another ABM movement lesson. Cerebra Grants Scheme funds up to 80% of the cost of equipment and services to help make life easier and more enjoyable for children with a neurological condition. They try to be flexible about what they can help with but some examples of what they have funded previously include special needs trikes, wheelchairs and buggies, sensory toys and certain therapies within the UK (please discuss this with them before applying for a therapy to make sure they can fund it).
